2020—What a year!

History will remember 2020 as a one-in-one hundred year experience.

This year, we saw the world change as the COVID-19 pandemic took hold in Melbourne. People were forced to stay at home, wear masks and, in the early days, even fought over toilet paper in the supermarket aisles!

The lockdown forced us to find new ways to stay together, while staying apart. Home schooling, working from home and online meetings became the 'new norm'. And whilst that would suit many in our community, our older members—and those without internet access—could have been left behind.

During the lockdown, we reached out to our older members and, where needed, provided food parcels, home maintenance and assistance. Zoom webinars were hosted by the New Zealand Sub Branch to ensure people were aware of services and assistance that was available, for their mental as well as physical health, and for people to stay in contact.

Our ANZAC Day—normally a day where thousands of people attend the Club saw just 6 socially distanced people commemorate the day. ANZAC Day services were cancelled, but people still got up early to 'Light up the Dawn' in their driveways to ensure the day was still commemorated. The 75th Anniversary of the end of World War 2, similarly saw no public gatherings, whilst by Remembrance Day in November a small service was able to be held at the Club.

During the lockdown, our Members supported the Club by purchasing Club gift cards, Squealers and Growlers of beer and bottles of wine. The caterers—who started in between lockdown periods—trialled home delivery, which was embraced by our members. Unfortunately, they did not renew their tenure with the club and, in early December, we were pleased to welcome Prior's Catering into our Kitchen, who are already getting rave reviews for their excellent food.

Our great Club was formed around the time of the last global pandemic—the 1919 Spanish Flu. As we head into our 102nd year, we invite our members to share the spirit of mateship through which our Club was born—a spirit and sense of community which has rarely been more evident than in 2020.

In 2021 we will see many Club favourite return—Member's night, Raffles, Bingo, Trivia etc—as well as some new initiatives—Sounds of Silent, Morning Melodies etc. We encourage all our Members and their friends to continue to support our Club as we as a community have supported each other this year, and as we will continue to support our Members who need assistance.

We wish all our Members and their friends and families a safe and Happy New Year, and look forward to what 2021 has in store!

ANZAC AND POPPY APPEALS

In 2020 we took our annual ANZAC and Poppy Appeals online.

As one of the first RSL's to offer online ANZAC Badge sales, we filled orders for badges and shipped throughout Australia. Our online badge sales totalled \$9,490.

With Remembrance Day looming, and Melbourne in lockdown and mandatory facemasks in place, in September, we began offering Poppythemed face masks for sale through our online store.

Again, we were one of the first to offer this service, and sold more than 270 masks. We were also able to place Poppy boxes in a few businesses and some local schools, and between the two initiatives, we raised \$1,759 for the Poppy Appeal.

We thank all of our Members who supported our Welfare initiatives in this most difficult year.




