2019 in review

2019 has been an important year for the Caulfield and New Zealand RSL Sub Branches and we thank you all for being part of it.

The Caulfield Sub Branch celebrated our Centenary year, and the New Zealand Sub Branch celebrated their 70th year in Victoria. We should be proud of both Clubs, and what the Members, Staff and Committees of those Clubs have achieved across the years to ensure that both Sub Branches survive and thrive.

The year has also been one of physical change within the Club, with new toilets adjacent to the Dining and Gaming Rooms (FINALLY!) completed and the introduction of the new food initiatives, with the cutting down of the main bar and installation of the display fridge of cakes and sandwiches plus the recent introduction of the Perfect Fryer to supply bar snacks to our Patrons from open until close. We continue to serve coffee from the Wild Timor Coffee Company, who are a Veteran-run business who support communities in East Timor to exist and thrive, whilst employing Veterans.

We have now marked around 12 months since the relocation of the TAB from its former location. Despite some predictions that this would be the downfall of the venue, the reverse is true. Whilst we may have lost some members because of that Strategic Plan decision, we have gained many more – mainly younger people with families – who appreciate the opportunity to access the 4 Court (when Melbourne's appalling weather allows!) without crossing the TAB. (In fact, earlier this year, we received an award from RSL Victoria for new membership growth.) You only need to look at the number of people who were in the Café Lounge area and 4 Court on Melbourne Cup Day to realise that this change was a positive move for the Club.



This is an old building, with some old equipment, but (should Melbourne's summer EVER arrive), we have new air conditioners to help us through the heat this year.

We regularly welcome community groups and kindred organisations to our Club for their meetings and lunches. These groups include Ex Service Organisations, Schools, Scouts, Cadet and Community groups. Many of these, and other corporate functions that we hosted in 2018 returned in 2019 and we have function bookings for 2020 as far out as December. Our ANZAC Day this year was the most successful ANZAC Day we have ever had – and was the most successful in the RSL Metropolitan network. Remembrance Day, and the Veterans lunch that followed were both better attended than we had expected, given that it fell on a Monday and was not a public holiday.

We have been chosen to be one of 3 venues in Melbourne to host the 'travelling roadshow' from the Australian War Memorial, to showcase the proposed changes to the Memorial to the public and seek community feedback. This free Community event will be held on December 10th (see page 5 for more information) and we encourage you to attend if you can.

Whilst the focus in the press seems to be on 'young veterans', over 75% of our Service Members are aged over 60. This Club's support for our veterans is not determined by their age – it is because they are a Veteran. Period. Not because they saw overseas service (or didn't), not because they are young (or old). They wore a uniform of either Australia or an allied Nation, and deserve our support, respect and assistance.

We have provided financial, emotional and physical support to a number of Australian and New Zealand veterans from the start of this year to the very moment this article is being written. Our Club is now recommended by others as a place that Veterans seeking welfare should go to seek help. We continue to encourage any Veteran who needs support of any kind to contact the Club.

THEY are the reason that we ask you to volunteer to collect for ANZAC and Poppy Appeals. THEY are the reason that the RSL Network exists. We encourage our members to assist us with future appeals by volunteering and helping to raise funds to help ALL of our Veterans, and not just leave it to a few dedicated volunteers. We find that, whilst we have no problem finding people prepared to attend Club social events, we need to work unnecessarily hard to have people support initiatives that support Veterans welfare, and we ask that you consider supporting future events that support the Welfare initiatives of this Club.

This Club would not function without the Management, Staff and Committee, and all deserve your support and thanks for their efforts across the year. We thank you for being a member and wish you and your families a safe and happy Christmas and a Happy and prosperous New Year.

Several weeks ago, we introduced a range of sandwiches, cakes, slices, wraps and Turkish Bread rolls to the Club. These items have proven very popular for those wanting a lighter lunch, or a sweet snack to accompany a coffee. They can be seen in the display case at the end of the main bar, near the gaming room, and are available all day and night.

More recently, we have introduced the 'Perfect Fryer' which allows us to serve hot bar snacks from when we open to until we close each day.

These snacks currently consist of: Beer Battered Chips, Potato Cakes, Dim Sims with Beer Battered Chips, Flathead fillets with Beer Battered Chips and Chicken Tenders with Beer Battered Chips. Condiments available include, Tomato, Tartare, Soy, Sweet Chilli and BBQ Sauces and Vinegar.

As a result of these changes, the kitchen hours for meal service are from II.30am—2.30pm and from 5.30pm —8.30pm (9pm on Friday & Saturday) At other times, the items above can be ordered from the main bar.

We hope to have the windows completed for ANZAC Day 2020.


